Good practices

- Through the creation of a mid-term management plan based on the CUC Vision 100, a system involving executives and faculty and staff is in place, and the founding principles are clarified and educational objectives organized. The plan is incorporated in the Chiba University of Commerce Integrated Report, a booklet compiling and making visible various activities as part of the value-creation process, which is widely distributed and published on the website. These initiatives in internal and external communication are worthy of evaluation.
- The storage battery equipment introduction plan related to the solar power equipment installed on the roofs of the university's buildings stores and enables use of semi-permanent electricity, and as a measure to seek the improvement of disaster prevention functions is an initiative worthy of evaluation.
- The CUC International Square has been established in a convenient location on the campus, foreign staff are assigned, various initiatives including events are implemented. The fact these initiatives contribute to improvements in students' language abilities through international interaction and the expansion of international outlooks is worthy of evaluation.
- The university aims to foster human resources in service innovation, runs a Service Innovation Award, implements other distinctive extra-curricular classes. As initiatives to inspire the innovative minds of students, they are worthy of evaluation.
- The university has formulated the Chiba University of Commerce SDGs Charter and is aiming to achieve a 100% Renewable Energy University as one of its environmental goals. The fact that initiatives contributing to consideration for the environment are conducted on a university-wide basis is worthy of evaluation.
- The university commissions evaluations of its initiatives to Chiba Prefecture's Ichikawa City, with which it has concluded a comprehensive agreement, Ichikawa City submits its Evaluation and

Opinions on the Initiatives of Chiba University of Commerce. This initiative to incorporate external evaluations and opinions is worthy of evaluation.
